PREREQUISITE(S)/COREQUISITE: Various fine arts/cultural history courses.

CALENDAR DESCRIPTION: Interdisciplinary Topics in Culture is an exploration of masterworks and common practices, in the cultural history of European and North American culture. An aspect of this exploration will be examining the ways in which these arts have influenced society at large, and how they have fit into the locations of study. Content changes each year based on location, depending on where the Fine Arts Department travels in the spring session. Topics will typically include aspects of the visual arts and music but additional topics, such as a cultural history of a geographic area, may be presented in some sessions.

CREDIT/CONTACT HOURS: 3(0-0-3) 45 Hours

DELIVERY MODE(S): Travel Study

OBJECTIVES: This course aims to provide you with the experience of Italian culture, history and visual art. During the fourteen-day intensive course we will travel from Rome to Florence to Venice touring historical sites, gardens, museums and galleries. You will be expected to keep a sketchbook that chronicles your research, observations and experiences through creative writing, journaling, sketches and drawings.

Prior to embarking on this trip you will be assigned two figures to research – one historical political figure and one Roman god or goddess. Throughout our travels we will encounter representations of these figures through painting, architecture and sculpture and it will be your responsibility to identify representations of these figures and inform the class as to their role and meaning in Italian culture. This will create an organic and immersive educational experience wherein our group can learn from each other and keep actively engaged in observing and processing our experiences. The informationresearch that you contribute and how you articulate your knowledge will comprise part of your class participation grade.

Throughout the course I will assign daily drawing projects that will inform and reveal aspects of historical art production that will enrich your understanding of Italian history and artists lives. Many of the drawing assignments will be experiential process drawings, others will be observational drawings from life studies.
