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CALENDAR DESCRIPTION: This course covers the welding technology and properties of metals components of the Alberta Apprenticeship Welder Training, 1st Period. Topics include: Electricity, Metal ID, Heat Treatment, Distortion, Hard Facing, Drawing Interpretation, Weld Symbols and Weld Types.
