Course Content:

This course is designed to help develop a greater understanding and appreciation of music. By the end of the course, you will be able, by listening, to identify elements within a piece of music, and identify several different genres and forms of Western art music. To achieve this, the beginning section of the course will focus on music fundamentals; we will learn what we can hear and do hear, discuss some basics of music theory, and learn terminology so that we can discuss what we are hearing. Throughout the semester, we will look at music history in its cultural context, examining it in relation to other arts and non-musical historical events that helped shape the music. We will study a wide variety of works, from the middle ages to modern times; these pieces are representative and often major works of the periods from which they are selected, and will represent various genres and media from the period. When we study the music of the 20th century, we will learn how musics from other parts of the world

have influenced and helped shape all the music we hear.
