Objective:

The student's goal in applied piano is primarily to improve their keyboard skills and further enhance their musicianship abilities. Through the study and performance of various styles of music, the program aims to develop a well rounded musician who is technically proficient and musically inspired. A high standard of performance is required in this course.

Course Content:

The student will receive one hour private lesson per week. Lessons will include repertoire pieces, technique, sight-reading and ear training as required components.

Master classes will be held to provide the students with an opportunity to improve their performing abilities and stage presence. Two juries will be performed by the student at the end of each semester.

*Performances in master classes and college noon hour concerts are required.

Weighting:

70% of the course mark is determined from the performance at weekly lessons. (35% from each semester).

30% of the course mark is determined from the performance in a jury held the day after the last day of classes in December and April (15% of the total mark from each semester).
