Course Description:

This is the second study applied lesson for music majors and music major B.Ed. students, and for students in the IDD program. This is the private study of <u>several</u> percussion instruments. No student is allowed to study only one instrument; rather, you will be expected to study and become proficient on several percussion instruments. Either the Jazz or Wind Ensemble will fulfill the lab requirement for percussion students.

You must be simultaneously enrolled in MU 1410.

Attendance:

It is expected that students will attend <u>all</u> lessons. If a student can not attend a class due to medical reasons or other extreme circumstances, it is necessary to give me advance notice. If you do not inform me in advance, you will not be able to make the lesson up.
