PREREQUISITE(S)/COREQUISITE: MU 1000 or satisfactory completion of music theory

CREDIT/CONTACT HOURS: 6(2-0-0) 60 Hours Two Terms

DELIVERY MODE(S): Studio Lesson and Master Class

OBJECTIVES (OPTIONAL): The lesson is one hour per week. There is also a weekly master class at which attendance is mandatory. This component of the course will enable all students to perform ensemble music, and explore various aspects of percussion literature and performance.
