CALENDAR DESCRIPTION: Students will gain experience performing ensemble literature from a variety of periods and genres. MU1410 is required for all Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Music Combined degree students registered in MU1250 and a recommended corequisite for other students registered in MU1240 or MU1250.
