Course Content:	The jazz ensemble is a performing group consisting of brass, woodwind, string, and percussion instruments that plays jazz band literature in at least two concerts per year. Participation in either the jazz or wind ensemble is a requirement or corequisite for students taking applied music and is open to other college students and members of the community.
