#### **CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:**

This is a study of Common Practice harmony, including elementary analysis with discussion of elements of formal contrapuntal writing, chord progressions, and chorale textures.

**DELIVERY MODE(S):** Lecture

**OBJECTIVES:** This course will cover the first half of the textbook; the remainder will be covered in MU1560. Students will solidify their understanding of notation, scales, modes, and chords. Counterpoint will be introduced, leading to a discussion of writing and analyzing diatonic harmony in four parts.

**LEARNING OUTCOMES:** Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to work with scales and modes, write basic counterpoint, and demonstrate basic

competency in writing and analysing diatonic harmony, including figured bass, cadences, non-harmonic devices, and voice leading.
