- Course Description: A study of elementary diatonic harmony.
- Prerequisite: MU1000 Rudiments of Music or satisfactory completion of a Music.
 Theory Placement Exam.
- Co-requisite: MU1510 Aural and Keyboard Skills I.
- 4. The Course in Perspective: This is a junior level theory course designed to give student a practical knowledge of diatonic harmony and focuses on developing compositional skills as well as musical analysis. It begins with a thorough review of basic diatonic material and ends with the harmonization of a melody and realizing a figured bass of moderate difficulty.
- Assignments: Students will have regular reading and written assignments from the text.
- Grading: The student's grade will be determined by the following weighting:
 - A) 20% for classroom participation and tests
 - B) 30% for assignments
 - C) 20% for mid-term examination
 - D) 30% for semester final examination
- Topics: Notation, scales, keys, modes, intervals, chords, tonality, harmony, cadences, nonharmonic tones, harmonic rhythm, melodic organization, phrasing, voice leading in four-part chorale style and harmonic progressions.
