PREREQUISITE(S)/COREQUISITE: MU 1000 or satisfactory completion of music theory placement exam and aural skills examinations.

COREQUISITES: MU 1400 OR MU1410 IS REQUIRED FOR ALL BACHELOR OF ARTS MUSIC MAJORS/MINORS IN BACHELOR OF ARTS AND BACHELOR OF EDUCATION.

Note: Restricted to full-time music majors/minor in Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Education.

REQUIRED TEXT/RESOURCE MATERIALS:

You will be required to purchase appropriate repertoire books as recommended by your Instructor.

CALENDAR DESCRIPTION: Private study of voice or your principal instrument. Restricted to full-time students in Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of Music Combined Degree Programs.

CREDIT/CONTACT HOURS: 3(.5-0-0) 15 Hours Two Terms

DELIVERY MODE(S): Studio Lesson, Master class; Moodle assisted.

OBJECTIVES: The piano lesson is one-half hour per week. Students are welcomed to attend master class. This component of the course will enable all students to perform, experience other student performances and explore various aspects of keyboard literature and performance.

It is expected that to pass this course, a student will be doing an hour of formal practice per day. As the student progresses, more hours per day of practice will undoubtedly enhance higher achievement.

If a student is insufficiently prepared for a lesson, the instructor reserves the right to suspend the lesson.

The April juries will consist of a performance of a minimum of two styles of music at the junior level and a minimum of one significant piece at the grade level of intermediate and senior students. Students will also display their proficiency at their technical exercises at the jury.

Master classes will be held on Tuesdays 1:00-2:00 p.m. in L106. Attendance for MU 1240 is voluntary and no additional marks will be given for attendance. Students in MU1240 are welcomed and encouraged to attend the master class to expand their knowledge of piano repertoire and gain experience in performing that will benefit your April jury.

Attendance at the Visitor in the Arts <u>Music</u> topics lectures is mandatory. If the student has a course conflict at this time, they will have an excused absence.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES: It is expected that students will attend <u>all</u> lessons. If a student cannot attend a lesson due to medical reasons, it is necessary to give the instructor advance notice. Advance notice of absence is required to your instructor for an excused absence and to qualify for a replacement lesson. Students are expected to attend all student and faculty performances each term.
