- Course Description: A continuation of the study of "Common Practise" harmony, including larger forms and writing in a variety of textures from the Classical to the 20th Century.
- 2. Prerequisite: MU2550 Music Theory III
- The Course in Perspective: The course begins with an indepth study of chromatic harmony and leads to an introduction to 20th century techniques. Students will be expected to analyze and emulate styles of the various periods.
