Paper #1: Importance of Communication in Nursing

Objective: To understand the significance of effective communication in nursing practice.

- Research and write a 3-4 page essay on the importance of effective communication in nursing
- Discuss how effective communication impacts patient outcomes, safety, and satisfaction
- Provide examples of situations where poor communication can lead to adverse events in healthcare
- Explore different communication techniques and strategies that nurses can use to improve patient communication

Guidelines:

- Incorporate a minimum of three (3) different types of credible sources, such as; books, journal articles, and web pages.
- All sources must be appropriately cited and referenced using APA 7th Edition format.
- Writing and presentation style must utilize APA 7th Edition format.

Paper #2: Compromised Communication

Objective: Effective Communication in Difficult Situations

Choose from the following subjects:

- a) Clients experiencing Anxiety (chap. 6)
- b) Clients experiencing Anger and Aggression (chap. 7)
- c) Clients experiencing Neurocognitive Disorders (chap. 9)
- d) Clients experiencing Loss, Grief, Dying and Death (chap. 10)
- Research and write a 3-4 page essay on the significance of effective communication in nursing care for clients in your chosen topic
- Identify key communication challenges faced by nurses in these situations.
- Examine existing models/strategies for effective communication in your chosen topic.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of these tools in enhancing communication and understanding patient needs.
- Reflect on how you will approach/cope with communicating with someone from your chosen topic.

Guidelines:

- Incorporate a minimum of three (3) different types of credible sources, such as; books, journal articles, and web pages.
- All sources must be appropriately cited and referenced using APA 7th Edition format.



• Writing and presentation style must utilize APA 7th Edition format.

Group Presentation

Objective: The primary objective of this group assignment is to explore and deepen understanding of nurse-client relationships, identify challenges in therapeutic communication, and develop effective strategies to improve communication in nursing practice.

- Groups will be provided with a case study illustrating a challenging nurse interaction. Analyze the case study to identify communication barriers and challenges. Consider cultural, emotional, and environmental factors that may impact communication.
- The group will present their case study to the class for further discussion.
- Prepare a 15-20 minute presentation to share your findings with the class. Use visual aids, role-playing, or other interactive elements to engage the audience. Address the following:
 - o Key components of effective nurse-client relationships.
 - o Challenges in therapeutic communication highlighted in the case study.
 - o Strategies to overcome communication barriers in healthcare settings.
- After each presentation, facilitate a 10-minute group discussion to allow classmates to ask questions and provide feedback

Guidelines:

- Groups of approximately 3-5 students
- Length: 10-20-minute presentation to the entire class
- Format: PowerPoint, role play, interactive etc (if you have any other media you would like to use please come talk to me)
- Include a list of references used
- You will compete a peer evaluation for members in your group based on attitude, quality of work, contribution to the group and being respectful of the others time and each contributing equally to the project

Professionalism & Participation

Students will receive marks based on attendance, active participation, collaboration, preparation, respect and attitude and timeliness based on a rubric.

Final Exam

The final exam is cumulative and includes all content covered throughout the course. Question format may include a variety of styles including, but not limited to multiple choice, short answer, long answer, matching, and select all that apply.

The final exam will be scheduled through the registrar's office.
