EVALUATION DESCRIPTIONS:

1. Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE)

The OSCEs provide students with the opportunity to demonstrate a range of clinical nursing skills as outlined in the textbook and practiced in the lab. Assessments are based on accurately completing the required steps for competently implementing the skill. Students must achieve a minimum passing score of 80% for each OSCE. If a student does not reach this passing score, they will be allowed up to three attempts to pass, with the score from their initial attempt used for final grading

2. Ticket to Lab

The 'Ticket to Lab' evaluation tool ensures students' readiness for lab sessions by assessing their preparation and understanding of pre-reading material. Points are awarded based on adherence to the lab dress code and accurate completion of pre-lab assessment questions. Failure to meet the dress code requirements or answer pre-lab questions accurately may lead to exclusion from lab participation. Two or more failures on lab tickets may jeopardize overall course success as students may be unable to acquire the necessary skills for evaluations. Students must be in attendance in order to receive the grade.

3. Midterm Exam

The midterm exam includes all content covered up to and including Week 7. Question format includes a variety of styles including, but not limited to multiple choice, short answer, long answer, matching, and select all that apply.

4. Final Exam

The final exam includes all content covered from Week 8 to Week 15. Question format includes a variety of styles including, but not limited to multiple choice, short answer, long answer, matching, and select all that apply
