To obtain credit in the course ALL assignments, examinations, and quizzes must be completed. Students are expected to make every effort to complete assignments on time. EAQ Expectations NS 2240

Description: 20% Grade

The EAQ is an assessment tool that contains exam style questions and is used to help students both succeed in their courses and to study effectively for the NCLEX. The goal is to achieve mastery through practice. In 2nd year the goal is to achieve a Mastery Level of 1 “Novice”.

To fulfil the requirements for the EAQ in NS 2240, students will log onto Evolve and open the course titled Elsevier Adaptive Quizzing: EAQ for NCLEX-RN Exam (36 Month) (eCommerce Version), 4th Edition, no marks will be allocated for students not working within this course.

To open the assignments, click on Assignments in the left-hand column of the course. There are four assignments that you need to be working in that have **Perfusion, Fluid & Electrolytes, Intracranial Regulation & Palliative** as their first name in the title of the assignment:

Students are expected to achieve a Mastery Level of **Novice** in each of the assignments posted for the 4 topics. Students need to achieve a Mastery Level of Novice in all 4 topic assignments to get full marks. However, if all four topics are not attempted, no marks will be allocated even if Mastery Level of Novice is achieved in other topics.

Note that answering questions correctly will facilitate levelling up more quickly. You can log in as much as you like before the due date of April 12, 2024.

Requirements for marks towards the final EAQ grade are as follows:

0 Marks	Did not attempt all four topics and/or did not achieve novice mastery in any topic
5 Marks	All four topics were attempted and achieved Mastery level ‘Novice’ in 1 of the topics
10 Marks	All four topics were attempted and achieved Mastery level ‘Novice’ in 2 of the topics
15 Marks	All four topics were attempted and achieved Mastery level ‘Novice’ in 3 of the topics
20 Marks (Full Marks)	All four topics were attempted and achieved Mastery level ‘Novice’ in 4 of the topics

Students are encouraged to work on EAQ questions **throughout the semester**. No marks will be awarded after the due date.
