PREREQUISITE: OA 1210, OA 1140, OA 1150 or their equivalents or consent of Instructor

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is designed to give students exposure to and a working knowledge of the Internet and its powerful research and interactive capabilities. Search engines, web page design (using HTML and Wizards) and electronic mail systems (Pegasus and Windows) are included. Other topics are: viruses, software piracy, ethics, multimedia, plug 'n plays, downloading from FTP sites, Internet access and connectivity.

COURSE OBJECTIVES: The student will

- be able to configure a hard drive system for the Internet
- access Internet resources efficiently
- employ search engines effectively
- use electronic mail
- be familiar with the Canada Copyright Act and its relevancy for software piracy
- be able to recognize computer virus invasions, eliminate them and restore resulting damaged files and disks
- download data and programs from FTP sites on the Internet
- design and create a web page using both HTML and Internet Wizards
