DESCRIPTION:

This course provides you with a background in medical terminology. It will assist you to recognize medical words by identifying Greek and Latin suffixes and prefixes, the root words, and combining forms. It will also assist you to correctly pronounce medical terms correctly and to recall and interpret medical abbreviations.
