1. Course Description:

2. Admission requirements:

- Current CARNA Registration (submit registration card as proof).
- Official transcripts from your basic nursing program.
- At least one year full-time experience in nursing practice. (Submit letter from current supervisor verifying at least one year experience). Or permission from the Chair of the Department of Nursing Education.
- Current certification in C.P.R.
- Current immunization for Hepatitis B.

3. The Course in Perspective:

This course is the first in a series of four courses designed to prepare the registered nurse to have the knowledge, clinical accountability and responsibility to be a competent perioperative nurse at the beginning level.
