CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:

Basic perioperative nursing skills are demonstrated and practiced in a laboratory setting under the supervision of the course instructor. At the completion of the course students will be able to demonstrate the roles of an intraoperative registered nurse. The scrub role includes surgical scrubbing, gowning, and gloving of self and others. Also, care, handling, and setup of instruments and equipment is practiced. A priority is placed on creating and maintaining a sterile field. The circulating role includes aseptically handling sterile items and practicing surgical conscience. A priority is placed on perioperative patient care including the nurse's role with anesthetics and intubation.

(Note: there could be an opportunity for registered nurses with perioperative practice experience to challenge OR4020 using PLAR [prior learning assessment and recognition]. All challenge requests are assessed by the instructor on an individual basis. Students must discuss challenge process with the instructor at outset of the program.)
