CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:

Basic perioperative nursing skills and surgical conscience are demonstrated and practiced in a laboratory setting under the supervision of the course instructor or delegate. At the completion of the course, students will be able to demonstrate the roles of the perioperative registered nurse. The scrub role includes surgical scrubbing, gowning, and gloving of self and others. Also, care, handling, and setup of instruments and equipment is practiced. A priority is placed on creating and maintaining a sterile field. The circulating nurse role demonstration and practice emphasizes comprehensive nursing care of the perioperative patient including the nurse's role with anesthetics and intubation. In addition, the circulating nurse role in supporting the set-up and maintenance of the sterile team is also demonstrated and practiced.

COURSE SCHEDULE/TENTATIVE TIMELINE:

All perioperative nursing skills outlined in OR 4020 perioperative nursing skills checklist are demonstrated and repeatedly practiced throughout the week in OR 4020 skills lab.

EVALUATION/GRADING CRITERIA:

Course evaluation is guided by OR 4020 perioperative nursing skills checklist. Students are evaluated by course instructor/designate and receive a PASS/FAIL grade (and credit/non-credit respectively on official transcript) based on demonstrated competency of critical perioperative nursing skills. (Note: there could be an opportunity for registered nurses with perioperative practice experience to challenge OR4020 using PLAR [prior learning assessment and recognition]. All challenge/PLAR requests are assessed by the instructor on an individual basis. Students must discuss challenge process with the instructor at outset of the program.)
