CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:

This course provides the opportunity for students to apply the knowledge gained in previous theory and lab courses in the **clinical practice setting**. Emphasis is placed on providing perioperative registered nursing care to patients undergoing surgical interventions in general surgery, gynecology, and orthopedics surgical services.

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DELIVERY MODE(S): Online delivery via Moodle learning management system, and Blackboard Collaborate and onsite clinical practicum.

OBJECTIVES:

The purpose of this course is to provide the student with opportunities to integrate and apply perioperative nursing knowledge and skills (gained in OR 4010, 4020 and 4030) in a perioperative clinical setting.

The overall course objective is to prepare the perioperative registered nurse student for safe and ethical perioperative nursing practice at a novice level of competency as defined by the Operating Room Nurses Association of Canada.

TRANSFERABILITY:

Students are cautioned that it is their responsibility to contact the receiving institutions to ensure transferability.

GRADING CRITERIA:

OR 4040 includes both an academic component and a clinical component grade. Four weekly journals and a perioperative nursing care plan assignment will provide the academic component grade that is worth 50% of the total OR 4040 grade. The clinical practicum component is worth the remaining 50% of the total OR 4040 grade. The clinical preceptor and instructor will evaluate each student in clinical practicum using a clinical evaluation tool. The student must successfully pass both the academic and clinical practicum components of the course to receive credit for OR4040. (**Note:** there is opportunity for registered nurses with perioperative practice experience to challenge clinical components of OR 4040. All challenge requests are assessed by the instructor on an individual basis utilizing the clinical evaluation tool. Students must discuss challenge process with the instructor at outset of the program.)

COURSE SCHEDULE/TENTATIVE TIMELINE:

OR 4040 Clinical practicum component – 310 hours are allocated as follows:

- The intent is that students will spend **three** weeks (93 hours) in general surgery, **three** weeks (93 hours) in gynecological surgery, **two** weeks (62 hours) in orthopedic surgery.
- Students will participate in miscellaneous learning experiences during the remaining **two** weeks (62 hours) –
 - Minimum 1 day (7 + hours) in PACU; (*Due to practicum time constraints students will have limited exposure to the care of the patient in post-anesthetic care unit.*)
 - 1 day (6-7hours) in EENT; 1 day with an anesthetist (6-7 hours); 12-14 hours with pediatric patients; 5 days (30-31 hours) in surgical area of students choice. (Students are also encouraged to spend ½-1 day in SPD/CSR, patient booking, pre-admission clinic, interventional radiology and pathology)
- Students submit one PACU self-report during clinical practicum.

OR 4040 Academic component –

- Four weekly clinical journals and one perioperative nursing care plan scholarly paper must be submitted during OR 4040.
