COURSE DESCRIPTION

Integration seminar provides a forum for students to resolve issues and explore areas related to their studies and their volunteer experiences. Information and assistance in the development of effective study skills will be provided.

CLASS FORMAT

Classes will be conducted in seminar style, requiring students' **ACTIVE** participation in discussions. Student involvement is crucial to the success of your integration seminar. Student led discussions and presentations will be incorporated.

Student agendas are posted on your instructor's office door. Students are encouraged to place on the agenda any items they wish dealt with during the seminar. Class time will consist of discussion of ongoing issues as identified by students on the agenda.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

1. Students will become familiar with the Rehabilitation Services Program and the field of rehabilitation.
2. Students will express their points of view, feelings, and concerns regarding courses and issues in the field of (re)habilitation.
3. Students will present an overview of their practicum setting.

EVALUATIONS
